Caracole is a leading nonprofit dedicated to positively changing the lives of individuals affected by HIV/AIDS in the Greater Cincinnati region. Founded in 1987, Caracole has been at the forefront of providing comprehensive support, education, and advocacy for those impacted by HIV/AIDS—ensuring access to quality healthcare, stable housing, and the resources necessary to live a healthy life.

Caracole's core work includes:

- **Prevention**. For those living with HIV, through treatment and medications, the virus can be rendered undetectable and un-transmittable, so people can live longer, healthier lives. Caracole advances prevention through free and confidential HIV testing, access to PrEP (an extremely effective preventative medication), harm reduction tools (such as safer-use supplies), and sexual health education.
- **Housing**. With safe and affordable housing, people living with HIV can focus on what is most important: their health. Caracole offers permanent supportive housing, short-term assistance (such as rent support), and education—all to help prevent homelessness and stabilize people living with HIV.
- **Care**. Importantly, Caracole provides individuals living with HIV access to personalized case management and pharmacy services. By providing comprehensive support—helping individuals with everything from medication adherence to cost assistance to mental health care or insurance support—they help to simplify and enhance care.

The name "Caracole" is derived from the Spanish word for "snail shell." As a snail grows, the shell will grow with it. In this spirit, Caracole's dedicated team of professionals, volunteers, and community partners work tirelessly to provide a safe space that grows to meet the changing needs of the people they serve. Through innovative programs and a commitment to continuous improvement, Caracole works to address the multifaceted challenges faced by those living with or at risk of HIV/AIDS.

The essence of Caracole is that together, we can serve as a beacon of hope and a catalyst for change, helping people live well—and thrive—with HIV. Together, we are more than an organization; we are a community of hope, resilience, and unwavering support.

The ideal candidate will thrive in collaborative and visionary roles and bring the expertise to create the operational infrastructure and community support to achieve ambitious goals. Building on the organization's signature programs, and in collaboration with Caracole's exceptional board and staff, the new CEO will set a course to expand the organization's impact, prioritizing racial and health equity through client-centered housing support, case management, prevention, and treatment.

About the Position

The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) provides strategic leadership and day-to-day management of Caracole, reporting to the organization's Board of Directors. The CEO will

- provide vision and articulate a strategy for Caracole's future; strengthen the organization's position as a leader and innovator in the fight against HIV/AIDS.
- collaborate with local and regional leaders to identify pathways for continued growth of Caracole's reach through innovative programs and partnerships.
- demonstrate a passion for and knowledge of the organization's mission and provide strong leadership to staff and volunteers; understand and implement best practices of nonprofit board governance.

Key Position Functions

Leadership and Management: Manage a results-driven, client-centered staff and provide leadership to the team. Ensure a strong culture of inclusion, accountability, transparency, and communication. Encourage innovation and creativity and lead by example. Oversee the development of metrics for effective team performance. Ensure that the agency demonstrates a strong commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion in all practices and operations.

Governance: Develop, maintain, and nurture a high-performing Board of Directors through strong governance standards and practices. In partnership with the Executive Committee, develop and implement the organization's strategic plan. Support the Governance Committee in identifying and recruiting board members, ensuring that Caracole's leadership reflects the diversity of its partner populations. Serve as an ex officio member on all board committees.





Vision and Strategy: Develop and articulate a vision and strategy for Caracole's future and mission. Seek and understand input and objectives of the community, board, staff, and other key stakeholders. Anticipate future needs and developments for the organization. Provide leadership in developing and implementing programmatic, organizational, and financial plans and policies. Develop, in collaboration with the Board of Directors, strategic and operating plans that meet Caracole's mission, changing lives in the fight against HIV/AIDS through prevention, housing, and care. Ensure plans and activities align with the overall strategy, and use a lens that prioritizes diversity, equity, inclusion, and access.

Advocacy and Community Relations: Understand the importance of alliances and partnerships. Maintain a high level of visibility and engagement with current and potential partners. Establish sound working relationships and cooperative arrangements with community, political, and corporate groups; volunteer organizations; and the general public to enhance services. Develop, strengthen, and nurture relationships with local, state, and national groups to facilitate funding, recognition, and broad support for Caracole's mission.

Communications and Resource Development: In partnership with the development team, oversee grant writing, fundraising planning, and implementation, including identifying resources of support and establishing development strategies. Assure the agency and its mission, programs, products, and services are consistently presented in a strong, positive image to relevant stakeholders. Oversee design, marketing, and promotion of services. Ensure strong collaboration across the resource development team and with other departments and staff within the organization. Maintain strong partnerships with current and potential funders.

Financial Management: In partnership with the CFO and Finance Committee, oversee the creation of the annual budget, ensuring that budget expectations are met or appropriately adjusted and communicated. Prudently manage the organization's resources within those budget guidelines according to current laws and regulations.
