Introduction to IBH Addiction Recovery

IBH Addiction Recovery (IBH) is a cornerstone in the Akron, Ohio, community, helping people recover from addiction and gain skills for a lifetime of sobriety. For adults with drug and alcohol addiction, including those with a co-occurring mental health disorder, IBH provides a tailored continuum of care, including Residential Treatment, Day Treatment, Outpatient Programs, Aftercare, and Recovery Housing, all complemented by spiritual guidance.

Since its founding in 1970, IBH has served tens of thousands of people from all backgrounds, striving to ensure that everyone who seeks addiction recovery finds a place of belonging, healing, and hope. As addiction continues to devastate families and communities, IBH remains at the forefront of addressing this crisis. With Ohio ranking fifth nationally in overdose deaths, IBH's mission is more critical than ever, driving us to expand access to care and deliver innovative, evidence-based solutions for lasting recovery.

Treatment Approach and Values

IBH's evidence-based services and treatment approach follows the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration's eight dimensions of wellness: Emotional, Environmental, Financial, Intellectual, Occupational, Physical, Social, and Spiritual. Additionally, IBH builds its treatment philosophy around four core values:

- **Dignity:** IBH values the dignity of every person.
- Community: Treatment at IBH occurs in a community, not in isolation.
- **Stewardship (Outcomes):** IBH believes that stewardship must be outcome driven and operate on a theory of change that will maximize our clients' opportunities to develop a life of sobriety.
- **Spirituality:** People have a spiritual dimension. We are made for activities and relationships that align with our true calling and are worthy of our dignity as people.

Service Locations

The IBH Main Campus, located approximately five miles outside of Akron, offers 85 acres of serene, rolling grounds, and thoughtfully designed facilities, creating a tranquil space for healing and recovery. Combining updated historic buildings with modern treatment spaces, the campus features a Therapy Center, Education Center, and expansive green spaces that foster reflection, community, and transformation.

The Firestone Park Outpatient and Aftercare Facility is conveniently located on the METRO RTA bus line near downtown Akron and the Main Campus. Here, IBH provides a spectrum of outpatient programs and the IBH REACH aftercare program. The facility's features—versatile meeting spaces, a computer lab, a drop-in center, and onsite peer support and referral services—foster recovery through practical resources and community connections.

2019-2024 Strategic Plan

IBH's strategic plan outlines key priority areas to advance its mission of offering personalized addiction treatment and supporting sustainable sobriety:





- Enhancing Treatment Programs: Expanding services across the continuum of care, adapting to
 Medicaid requirements, and integrating mental health awareness into addiction recovery, with
 an emphasis on personalized and family-inclusive treatment options.
- Strengthening the Team: Attracting and retaining high-quality staff through enhanced recruitment strategies, training, career development, and engagement initiatives, while fostering a diverse and inclusive work environment.
- **Board Development:** Building a strong, accountable Board of Trustees through orientation, education, and governance best practices to provide effective leadership and oversight.
- Increasing Visibility and Community Engagement: Launching a comprehensive marketing plan, strengthening donor relationships, and celebrating IBH's achievements to ensure that IBH is recognized as a premier addiction recovery provider.
- **Ensuring Financial Sustainability:** Diversifying funding streams, improving operational efficiencies, and maintaining robust financial performance to support long-term growth and stability.
- Campus Improvements: Creating inviting and secure facilities, aligned with the organization's
 values, through master planning efforts and facility enhancements to meet evolving client and
 staff needs.

The plan emphasizes collaboration, continuous improvement, and alignment with IBH's values of dignity, community, stewardship, and spirituality to ensure the organization remains a leader in addiction recovery services.

About the Opportunity

IBH Addiction Recovery seeks a collaborative, experienced, visionary leader to oversee the agency's continued success serving individuals with high-quality, responsive, person-centered care. The incoming CEO will collaborate with a committed Board of Trustees and a talented staff to shape the vision and strategy to guide the agency into its next era.

The ideal candidate will be an experienced leader of large, multi-functional teams and bring a strategic approach to working with staff at all levels to continue providing best-in-class, client-centered care. They will bring—or quickly gain—an understanding of the operations and funding mechanisms of residential and outpatient recovery programming. In partnership with the talented Board of Trustees, the IBH Foundation Board, and staff, they will build relationships with diverse stakeholders including partner agencies, law enforcement, clients, and donors to elevate the organization's profile and continued impact.

Key Position Functions

Vision and Strategy: Develop and articulate a vision and strategy for IBH's future and mission. Seek and understand input and objectives of the community, board, staff, and other key stakeholders. Anticipate future needs and developments for the organization. Develop, in collaboration with the Board of Trustees, strategic and operating plans that anticipate marketplace trends and meet IBH's mission as





well as address demonstrated community need for recovery and associated mental health and behavioral health needs. Ensure plans and activities align with the overall strategy.

Leadership and Management: Hire and manage a results-driven staff and provide leadership to the team. Oversee staff development, providing ongoing coaching and feedback on employee performance. Ensure a strong culture of accountability, transparency, and communication. Set and model IBH's culture, values, and behavior. Develop metrics for effective team performance. Manage the organization and operations with a focus on continuous improvement.

Governance: Serve as primary staff liaison to IBH's Governing and Foundation boards. Develop, maintain, and nurture a high-performing Board of Directors through strong governance standards and practices. In partnership with board leadership, onboard new board members and develop plans to leverage expertise and relationships and deepen engagement. Coordinate with the IBH Foundation Board for facility and operations support. Ensure board members of diverse viewpoints and backgrounds are engaged in the substantive work of IBH.

Financial Management: Direct and oversee the activities of the Chief Financial Officer and bear ultimate responsibility for IBH's fiscal integrity. Oversee the creation of the annual budget, ensuring that budget expectations are met or appropriately adjusted and communicated. Prudently manage the organization's resources within those budget guidelines according to current laws and regulations. Interpret financial data for board and staff, ensuring financial performance aligns with agency priorities.

Advocacy and Public Policy: Understand the importance of alliances and partnerships. Maintain a high level of visibility and engagement with current and potential partners. Build and maintain strong relationships with Summit County ADM (Alcohol, Drug, and Mental Health), Summit County Health Department, community treatment and mental health providers, and referral sources. Develop, strengthen, and nurture relationships with local, state, and federal legislators to facilitate funding, recognition, and broad support for addiction treatment and mental and behavioral healthcare.

Program Development and Oversight: Collaborate with staff leadership to develop and implement programs that support the organization's mission and strategic goals and address unmet needs in the community. Conduct periodic and ongoing needs assessments. Establish and/or maintain exemplary standards for client service. Ensure policies and procedures align with agency, state, federal, CARF, and other governing procedures. Maintain Medicaid Managed Care (MCOs) service provider and billing certification. Assess opportunities for partnership and identify pathways to expand the organization's reach and impact.

Resource Development: Lead revenue development and fundraising initiatives to ensure IBH has the resources to sustain and grow its work. Work closely with IBH staff, board, and consultants to develop fundraising strategies for annual operating support, future capital needs, and long-term organization's sustainability. Ensure alignment of resource development goals and agency needs.

Nestled in the heart of Northeast Ohio, south of Lake Erie, Akron is a vibrant city known for its rich history, diverse culture, and thriving community spirit. Located on the Glaciated Allegheny Plateau in the Great Lakes region, its central location provides easy access to major cities like Cleveland and Pittsburgh, as well as a well-connected regional transportation network. A hub for innovation and thriving culture, Akron offers an appealing mix of urban amenities and small-town charm.

 provide top-tier care across a range of specialties, such as Summa Health, Akron Children's
